### *The Clinical Study:*

#### ***“A Randomized Study of the Effects of Two Relaxation Music CDs on Stress Factors in Adult Cancer Patients Receiving Chemotherapy”***

This clinical trial is medically approved (by an Institutional Review Board-IRB) with neurological, biological, psychological, environmental and quality of life measurements. We are working with 2 major cancer centers and 5 independent researchers. Our Goal is to learn how the stress of chemotherapy treatment affects a cancer patient's mind, body, sense of well-being and how *SPECIFIC MUSIC* could help.

### *Our Intention:*

***to measure the chronic symptoms often associated with chemotherapy treatment including:***

Stress

Compromised immune system

“Chemobrain” - (the frustrating mental confusion that often results from chemotherapy)

Disrupted sleep and eating patterns

Depression and psychological states

### *Our Goal:*

***to help minimize these chronic symptoms before they become a part of everyday life for cancer patients and their families. This research may hold the answer.***

The whole person - not just a body part

A wide range of cancer types

Male and female patients

Brain waves and neurological function

Immune system and stress levels

Emotional and psychological states

Environmental influences
